ORDER

During the current government shutdown, the court continues to have a constitutional duty to hear and resolve cases. As judges rely on their chambers staff and other employees and officers of the court to perform functions necessary and essential to the continued resolution of cases, all of the district court's employees are directed to report to work during their normally scheduled hours. This includes staff in the Clerk's Office, the Probation Office, the Pretrial Services Office, and chambers staff, but not staff at the Bankruptcy Court, which will operate under separate directives issued by Chief Bankruptcy Judge Robert Faris and/or the Clerk of the Bankruptcy Court. Expenditures for travel and other expenses shall be limited to those necessary to support the court's operation.

If warranted by future circumstances, individual staff members covered by this order may be furloughed only at the direction of the head of any court unit upon consultation with the undersigned Chief Judge.

This order, which is intended to be consistent with an order entered by Chief Judge Alex Kozinski of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, shall remain in effect throughout the shutdown unless otherwise ordered.
