ORDER REGARDING ELECTRONIC DEVICES
IN JUDGE WATSON'S COURTROOM

Attorneys of record are authorized to bring electronic devices, such as laptops, cell phones, and tablets, into the courthouse for the sole purpose of using the devices in connection with case-related proceedings in Judge Derrick K. Watson's courtroom or chambers. Any attorney of record bringing an electronic device into the courthouse pursuant to this order shall inform the court security officers at the entrance to the courthouse of the time of the attorney's proceedings and the name of the case. Persons other than attorneys of record (including paralegals or other legal staff, parties, and witnesses) are not authorized by this order to bring electronic devices into the courthouse.

An attorney of record in a case before Judge Watson is not authorized by this order to bring any electronic device into the courthouse for a matter other than a hearing before Judge Watson or a case-related conference with Judge Watson.


No device may disrupt any court proceedings. For example, cell phones must be turned off upon entering the courthouse and turned on only with permission of the court. In no event may any camera or audio/video equipment be used in Judge Watson's courtroom or chambers to photograph or to record on video or audio any person or proceedings without the permission of the court. In particular, no witness or juror may be photographed in the courthouse with an electronic device brought into the courthouse pursuant to this order. Further, no electronic device may be connected to the internet while in Judge Watson's courtroom or chambers absent permission of the court.

Judge Watson may modify this order at his discretion in specific cases or for specific proceedings, including issuing an order that, in a particular case, no electronic devices are allowed.

Anyone violating this order will be subject to sanctions.
