ORDER

This Court having been fully advised that cellular phones, paging devices and personal digital assistants may be modified, enabling them surreptitiously to record sound and pictures, and further, that such devices may be altered to conceal firearms or explosive devices;


And having received the recommendation of the United States Marshals Service that, consistent with the heightened national security level, visitors' cellular phones, paging devices and personal digital assistants should not be admitted to the United States Courthouse;

IT IS ORDERED that the U.S. Marshals Service develop policies and procedures whereby the cellular phones, paging devices and personal digital assistants of all visitors shall be retained by Court Security Officers at the entrance to the U.S. Courthouse and returned to visitors upon their departure from the Courthouse.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a District Judge or Magistrate Judge may order, by written or minute order, attorneys of record be permitted to bring in laptops, cell phones and other electronic devices to assist them with a court matter. The order shall list what devices are permitted and shall be supplied to the Court Security Officers at the Court entrance to provide for accurate screening.

THIS ORDER AMENDS the Court Security Policy dated September 16, 2002.
