MAY 29, 2020 TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER RESUMING GRAND JURY SESSIONS IN THE DISTRICT OF HAWAII DURING THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY

Given the state of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and public health emergency in the State of Hawaii, including the continued need to protect grand jurors, court employees, witnesses, and others from being exposed to the COVID-19 virus, and taking into account the need for federal grand juries to continue to meet, the court orders that grand jury proceedings in the District of Hawaii may commence during the week of June 1, 2020 with appropriate mitigation measures in place.

On days that a grand jury is in session but the courthouse is otherwise closed, the United States Marshals Service shall permit courthouse entry to grand jurors and others with grand jury business such as witnesses, attorneys, court reporters, and interpreters, and shall permit entry to members of the public for the purpose of attending any return of indictment(s) by the grand jury.
